The Alpha Phi Fraternity colony was started on September 1, 1990 by traveling consultant Renee Hoffman and colony supervisor Kristi Hanson. The advisory board members were: Lois Sachleben Groth, Delta-Cornell; Priscilla Newton Meyer, Gamma Phi-Florida State; Ellen Bergstrom, Delta Eta-Adrian; Betty Lackey George, Gamma Phi-Florida State; Judy Jones, Beta Lambda-Rollins. The 35 undergraduate women and three alumnae initiates were initiated on October 6<sup>th</sup>, 1990 and the chapter was officially installed. The installation was coordinated by Priscilla Meyer and held in the Denius Student Center. The chapter was presented to the chapter by Presented by Mary Berkmoes Carroll, International Vice President-Alumnae. The international officers present were: Vice President Mary Carroll, District Governor Alice Molitor King, District Alumnae Coordinator Anne Scarborough Stout, and Colony Supervisor Kristi

Hanson. The foundation presented a gift of \$1000 to Holmes Regional Cardiac Unit, represented by Stephen Bunker.
